## A Special Report on the State of Wakulla Springs

Wakulla discharges an average of 250 million gallons of water per day, but only about 70-80 million during drought. Where does that water come from? And, what happens if droughts persist, development maintains its current pace, and sea levels continue to rise? The long term viability of Wakulla Spring and the rest of the Floridan aquifer depend on our willingness and ability to balance the water budget. Dr. Todd Kincaid will present results of recent studies in the Wakulla Springshed that bear on our water budget.
