When you arrive and check in with the International Student Advisor (*before you can register for classes*) you must purchase a sufficient medical insurance policy or prove adequate medical coverage by having your insurance company abroad mail or fax to us a verified copy of the International Insurance Compliance Form which you will receive with your Form I-20.

Married Students: If your spouse accompanies you to the United States, you must add proof of \$3,000 for your spouse and proof of \$1,700 for each child who accompanies you.

Summer Semester 9-Hour Rule

Undergraduate students entering with less than 60 semester hours of credit must earn at least nine semester hours prior to graduation by attendance during one or more summer sessions. Summer school is optional for students entering with 60 semester hours of credit.

Expenses	<u>\$ 3,000</u>
Total (Summer)	\$ 6,109
TOTAL EXPENSES	\$28,246 (FOR TWELVE MONTHS)

* Based on 12 undergraduate credit hours per semester. Add \$518.19 for each additional credit hour. To graduate in four years, summer school and/or 15 hours of classes some academic semesters will be required.
