

# University Housing



## CAMPUS MAILING ADDRESS

Your mailing address at UWF will be a post office box number. Once on campus, you will need to obtain your post office box at the University Post Office conveniently located in the University Commons.

## VEHICLES AND PARKING

Student vehicles are permitted on campus and must be registered upon arrival. Convenient parking is available near each residential community. Parking permits are sold at the Cashier's Office.

## OTHER TRANSPORTATION

A trolley service is available for getting around campus and for off-campus trips to a local shopping center. Bicycles are also a popular means of transportation, particularly on UWF's beautiful bike paths. Bicycle racks are available near each residential community; students are responsible for the safety of their possessions.

## TELEPHONE SERVICE

Local phone service and voice mail are provided in each student room at no additional charge, with one phone line per bedroom (bring your own phone.)

## CABLE TV

Students who live on campus may enjoy basic cable TV service at no additional charge. To access the service, you must have a cable ready television and a coaxial cable.

### SAFETY AND SECURITY

**University police are sworn State of Florida law enforcement officers.**

They patrol the campus 24/7 by foot and patrol car. Trained staff (resident assistants, graduate hall directors, and professional residence life coordinators) is located in each residential area to help with upon request. Each residence hall or apartment entrance is locked and accessible only to resident students.

### RESIDENCE LIFE STAFF

The Housing and Residence Life staff is ready to assist you in making your new home a positive environment that supports your academic pursuits. Resident Assistants (RA's) are part-time, professionally trained staff who live on campus and supervise the housing communities. These dedicated student staff members are here to help you get involved, meet people, and make the best use of the campus resources available to you.

### RESIDENTIAL CAMPUS LIFE

The RA's develop exciting programs and multicultural theme weeks to enrich the lives of university housing residents. Whatever may be happening on campus, live performances, music, movies, comedians, games, sports, and events such as Casino Night, Fall Frenzy, and Homecoming, you are right in the middle of it all.

### THE DELPHI PROGRAM

The Delphi Program is the First Year Experience (FYE) Program required for any freshman student living in **Martin Hall**. The FYE Program is designed to help you navigate your first semester by reserving spaces in selected general requirement courses during your freshman year. This program will bridge the gap between what students are learning in the classroom with their out of classroom college experiences.

## HOUSING OPTIONS

### SOUTHSIDE VILLAGES

**South Side Village** residence halls are nestled into the heart of the UWF campus. Set in clusters amid academic and administrative buildings, each Southside residence hall has 16 rooms in four private foyers surrounding a courtyard that is just for the use of the residence of that hall. Each building is home to approximately 30 students. Rooms are double-occupancy.

#### Room Features:

Paid utilities, including air-conditioning—Fully furnished rooms with extra-long twin beds, desks, dressers, and micro fridge unit—Private bathrooms with bathtubs—Built-in closets—Wireless Internet access—Cable television access—Local telephone service—Deadbolt locks—Smoke detectors.

#### Building Features:

Coin-operated laundry facilities for each building—Private courtyard for residents of each building—Building locked 24 hours a day—A convenient area office—Two-story foyers with spiral staircases.

### RESIDENCE HALLS

**Argo Hall, Martin Hall, and Pace Hall** offer accommodations with double- and triple-occupancy rooms and private bathrooms in each room. Each hall is home to between 180 and 300 students.

**Heritage Hall**, scheduled to open Fall 2010, will offer suite-style single and double rooms.

#### Room Features:

Paid utilities, including air-conditioning—Fully furnished rooms with extra-long twin beds, desks, dressers, and micro fridge unit—Private bathrooms—Cable television access—Local telephone service—Two Internet connections per room—Smoke detectors and sprinkler system—Deadbolt locks.

#### Building Features:

Coin/card-operated laundry facilities located on the first floor—Community areas and TV lounges—Area offices conveniently located in each building—Buildings locked 24 hours a day.

### UNIVERSITY VILLAGE STUDENT APARTMENTS

The **University Village Student Apartment** communities offer the privacy of individual bedrooms and the convenience of on-campus location. There are two complexes, referred to as **Village East** and **Village West**. The Village West apartments have individual washers and dryers; in Village East the laundry facilities are centrally located in the clubhouse. These communities are primarily occupied by upper division students.

#### Apartment Features:

Paid utilities, including air-conditioning—Furnished with couch, chairs, extra-long twin beds, desks, and dressers—Two or four bedroom apartments with one or two bathrooms—Deadbolt locks—Smoke detectors and sprinkler system—Washer and dryer in each apartment in UVSA-West; laundry facilities located in the clubhouse in UVSA-East—Kitchen with full-size cooking range with vent hood, microwave, dishwasher, and refrigerator—Bedrooms have their own cable connection, private phone line, and Ethernet connectivity for personal computers—Area offices conveniently located in each apartment community.

### INTERNET ACCESS:

**ResNet** is the computer network in the **UWF Residence Halls** and the **University Village Student Apartments**. ResNet gives residents access to UWF's computer network and to the Internet.

- In order to connect to the network, your computer must have an Ethernet port, and you must also have an Ethernet cable.
