

**University of West Florida Regulation
UWF/REG 3.031 Grading Information**

- (1) The following table represents the numerical equivalents for course letter grades for calculation of a student's grade point average (GPA).

C+	Average	2.30

- (2) The following table displays the definitions of additional course grades and transcript symbols. These grades are not included when GPA is computed:

CR	Credit Awarded-Accelerated Methods
G	Deferred Grade (thesis and dissertation only)
I	Incomplete
I*	Grade Not Reported
P	Pass
S	Satisfactory
W	Withdrawn
AW	Academic Withdrawal
TR	Withdrawal with full refund of fees
WR	Withdrawal with partial refund of fees
X	Audit
XX	No Grade
*	Withdrawn (W or WF not yet reported)

- (3) In computation of the required GPA for academic standing and conferral of a degree, the total number of quality points (grade points multiplied by course semester hour credits) is divided by the total number of semester hours for which letter grades are received (per the table in paragraph (1)). All academic requirements tied to a specific letter grade average should be interpreted to mean the numerical average associated with a specific

letter grade. Hence, where “C average or better” is required, this is interpreted as “2.0 average or better.”

- (4) Student teaching, practica, and special courses are graded on a Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory “S/U” basis.
- (5) With the approval of the student’s assigned advisor, undergraduate students may take selected courses on a Pass/Fail (P/F) basis. The Pass/Fail option may not be used for any University or departmentally required courses.
- (6) Course work completed in any student classification (including non-degree) will be included in the student’s undergraduate or graduate GPA as determined by the level of the course.
