

RESIDENCY RECLASSIFICATION

To request a reclassification to *Florida residency for tuition purposes*, you should complete the attached form entitled "Request for Change of Residency Status" and submit for review one month prior to the beginning of the semester for which the reclassification is requested.

1. The deadline for submission of a request is one week (7 days) prior to the first day of classes for the semester for which reclassification is requested.
2. All required documentation must be submitted prior to the published last day of drop/add for the semester in question.
3. An applicant may not be eligible for reclassification as a resident for tuition purposes, unless the applicant (or parent/legal guardian if claiming dependent status; or spouse if claiming marital status) presents clear and convincing documentation that supports permanent legal residency in this state for at least 12 consecutive months rather than temporary residency for the purpose of pursuing an education.
4. Full-time permanent employment is defined as consecutive employment in a permanent job for a minimum of 12 months prior to the semester of qualification (minimum of thirty hours a week). Permanent employment is not defined as a *series* of temporary jobs.
5. A permanent home (for independent students) is evidenced by the student's name being listed on the lease, rental agreement, utility bills, etc. If claiming residency by dependent or marital status, documentation should be in the name of the claimant. Residence in someone else's home (i.e. boyfriend/girlfriend, fiancé fiancée, friend, etc.) does not constitute a permanent residence.
6. The University of West Florida uses email as the official method of notification regarding the review process. Please ensure that you have activated your UWF email account (e.g., jrd1@students.uwf.edu) for purposes of receiving important information related to your request.

In completing your "Request for Change of Residency Status", you will be required to submit supporting documentation dated, issued, or filed 12 months prior to the first day of classes of the semester for which the request is filed.

To qualify as a Florida resident for tuition purposes, you must meet the following basic requirements:

1. be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident alien, or legal alien granted indefinite stay by the U.S. Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) - **applicable to student and the individual (i.e. parent, legal guardian, spouse) claiming Florida residency status**
2. be independent and have resided in the state of Florida for the previous 12 months with the intent of establishing a permanent home, not merely incidental to enrollment at an institution of higher education
OR
be dependent and your parent, legal guardian, or adult relative (resided with for 5 years), has resided in the state of Florida for the previous 12 months with the intent of establishing a permanent home (requires copy of current IRS return from parent, legal guardian or adult relative and supporting documentation of the parent, etc.)
OR
be the spouse of someone who has resided in the state of Florida for the previous 12 months with the intent of establishing a permanent home (requires copy of marriage certificate, copy of student's Florida driver's license, voter registration or vehicle registration and supporting documentation of the spouse).
3. non-enrollment at an institution of higher education (i.e. UWF) for the prior 12 month qualifying period (if claiming independent status) AND
4. full-time permanent employment for the prior 12 months and proof of a permanent home in Florida which has been occupied as a primary residence for the prior 12 months OR purchase of a home in this state and residence therein for the prior 12 months AND
5. establishment and maintenance of legal ties (i.e. Florida driver's license, vehicle registration, voter registration) for the prior 12 months

In the absence of non-enrollment for the 12 month qualifying period, clear and convincing documentation demonstrating the establishment of a permanent residence PRIOR TO application and enrollment is required (may include, but not limited to):

Establishment (and subsequent maintenance) of Florida legal ties (i.e. driver's license, vehicle registration, voter registration) PRIOR TO application and enrollment

Establishment (and subsequent maintenance) of permanent Florida employment PRIOR TO application and enrollment

Establishment (and subsequent maintenance) of permanent Florida home PRIOR TO application and enrollment

Less than full-time enrollment during 12 month qualifying period

Establishment (and subsequent maintenance) of specialized medical treatment in Florida PRIOR TO application and enrollment

Establishment (and subsequent maintenance) of Florida disability benefits PRIOR TO application and enrollment

Discharge from active duty military service (Florida as state of legal residence) and subsequent immediate move to Florida PRIOR TO application and enrollment

REQUEST FOR CHANGE OF RESIDENCY STATUS

INSTRUCTIONS: Please read the following information concerning residency. If you believe you qualify for Florida resident for tuition purposes status, complete this form, attach all requested copies, and submit the package one week (7 days) prior to the first day of classes of the semester for which you seek reclassification. The University of West Florida uses email as the official method of notification regarding the review process. Please ensure that you have activated your UWF email account (e.g., rd1@students.uwf.edu) for purposes of receiving important information related to your request.

A Florida "resident for tuition purposes" is a person who has, or a dependent person whose parent or legal guardian has, established and maintained legal residence in Florida for at least twelve months. Residence in Florida must be as a bona fide domicile rather than for the purpose of maintaining a residence incident to enrollment at an institution of higher education. Other persons not meeting the twelve-month legal residence requirement may be classified as Florida residents for tuition purposes only if they fall within one of the limited special categories determined by Florida Statutes, Florida Administrative Code and the Board of Governors. All other persons are ineligible for classification as a Florida "resident for tuition purposes". Living in or attending school in Florida will not, in itself, establish legal residence. Students who depend on out-of-state parents for support are presumed to be legal residents of the same state as their parents.

FLORIDA RESIDENT FOR TUITION PURPOSES STATEMENT

This section must be completed in full if you claim Florida residency for tuition purposes.

• **Attach copies of required documentation** (if any).

• A notarized copy of your and/or your parents' most recent tax return or other documentation **may** be requested to establish dependence/independence.

Dependent: A person for whom 50% or more of his/her support has been provided by another

Independent: A person who provides 50% or more of his/her own support

- A. I am an **Independent** person and have maintained legal residence in Florida for at least 12 months.
- B. I am a **dependent** person and my parent or legal guardian has maintained legal residence in Florida for at least 12 months. (**Required:** Copy of most recent tax return on which you were claimed as a dependent or other proof of dependency.)
- C. I am a **dependent** person who has resided for five years with an adult relative other than my parent or legal guardian, and my relative has maintained legal residence in Florida for at least 12 months. (**Required:** Copy of most recent tax return on which you were claimed as a dependent or other proof of dependency.)
- D. I am **married** to a person who has maintained legal residence in Florida for at least 12 months. I have now established legal residence and intend to make Florida my permanent home. (**Required:** Copy of Marriage Certificate, and other supporting documentation for residency.)
- E. I was previously enrolled at a Florida state institution and classified as a Florida resident for tuition purposes. I abandoned my Florida domicile less than 12 months ago and am now re-establishing Florida legal residence.
- F. According to the U.S. Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services, I am a **permanent resident alien** or other legal alien granted Indefinite stay and have maintained a domicile in Florida for at least twelve months. (**Required:** INS documentation and proof of residency status.)
- G. I am a **member of the armed services** of the United States and I am stationed in Florida on active military duty pursuant to military orders, or whose state of legal residence is Florida, or I am a member's spouse or dependent child. (**Required:** Copy of military orders or DD2058 showing state of legal residence.)
- H. I am a full-time instructional or administrative employee **employed by a Florida public school, community college or institution** of higher education, or I am the **employee's spouse or dependent child**. (**Required:** Copy of employment verification)
- I. I am part of the **Latin American/Caribbean Scholarship Program**. (**Required:** Copy of scholarship papers)
- J. I am a qualified beneficiary under the terms of the **Florida Pre-Paid College Program**, S.1009.988,F.S. (**Required:** Copy of card.)
- K. I am living on the Isthmus of Panama and have completed 12 consecutive months of college work at the F.S.U. Panama Canal Branch, or I am the student's spouse or dependent child. (**Required:** Copy of marriage certificate or proof of dependency)
- L. I am a **Southern Regional Education Board's** Academic Common Market graduate student. (**Required:** Certification letter from State Coordinator)
- M. I am a full-time **employee of a state agency** or political subdivision of the state whose student fees are paid by the state agency or political subdivision for the purpose of job-related law enforcement or corrections training.
- N. I am a **McKnight Fellowship** recipient. (**Required:** Verification from graduate studies)
- O. I am an **active member of the Florida National Guard** who qualifies under s.250.10 (7) and (8) for the tuition assistance program.
- P. I am an **active duty member (or the spouse of the member) of the Armed Services** of the United States attending a public community college or university within 50 miles of the military establishment where the member is stationed, if such a military establishment is within a county contiguous to Florida.
- Q. I am an **active duty member (or spouse or dependent child of a member) of the Canadian military** residing or stationed in Florida under the North American Air Defense (NORAD) Agreement, attending a public community college or university within 50 miles of the military establishment where the active duty member is stationed.
- R. I am a U.S. Citizen living outside the U.S. who is teaching at a Department of Defense Dependent School or in an American International School and who has enrolled in a graduate level education program which leads to a Florida teaching certificate.
- S. I am an active duty member (or spouse or dependent child of the member) of a foreign nation's military who is serving as a liaison officer. I am residing or stationed in Florida and attending a community college or state university within 50 miles of the military establishment where I am stationed.

PERSON CLAIMING RESIDENCY SHOULD COMPLETE THIS SECTION IN FULL

Documents supporting the establishment of legal residence must be dated, issued, or filed **12 months before the first day of classes** of the term for which a Florida resident classification is sought. All documentation is subject to verification.

Additional documentation other than what is required above may be requested in some cases.

DOCUMENTATION

CLAIMANT: Respond to the following Sections A, B, C, and D as applicable, by providing the original documents or photocopies for review.

Section A – [for Independent Students]

1. Proof of independent status is required (students who do not meet the definition of “independent” status as defined in the Residency Reclassification guidelines must provide current IRS returns for student and parents).
2. Employment (letter from employer: notarized or on letterhead, verifying employment address, dates and status of employ (e.g. permanent) and number of hours worked per week). Students required to prove their “independent” status are also required to provide rate of pay.
3. Domicile (rental: copy of lease/rental agreement plus 12 months’ canceled checks or utility bills; home ownership: warranty deed and current mortgage statement or current utility bill). Claimant’s name must be on official documentation.

Section B – [for Dependent Students]

1. Proof of dependent status is required (current IRS return for parents)
2. Employment of parent, as applicable (letter from employer: notarized or on letterhead, verifying employment address, dates and status of employ (e.g. permanent) and number of hours worked per week).
3. Parent(s)’ Domicile (rental: Copy of lease/rental agreement plus 12 months’ canceled checks or utility bills; home ownership: warranty deed and current mortgage statement or current utility bill). Claimant’s name must be on official documentation.

Section C – [for all students; if dependent, provide parents’ copies]

1. Driver’s license (photo copy required)
2. Vehicle registration (photo copy required)
3. Voter’s registration (photo copy required)

Section D – [optional: may be used to further substantiate your claim]

1. Declaration of Domicile (filed at County Courthouse)
2. Florida banking (letter from bank or 1st and last months’ bank statements)
3. Homestead Exemption (most recent receipt)
4. Business/Occupational License or Incorporation (photo copy, etc.)
5. Military discharge and establishment of Florida residency prior to initial enrollment (DD-214 and supporting residency documentation)
6. Florida social service benefits (i.e. disability, assisted housing, health care, food stamps, child care assistance)
7. Florida identification card

Determination of Dependent or Independent Status

Definitions:

The determination of dependent or independent status is important because it is the basis for whether the student has to submit his/her own documentation of residency (as an independent) or his/her parent's or guardian's documentation of residency (as a dependent). The following definitions are provided in rule:

Independent Student. A student who meets any one of the following criteria shall be classified as an independent student for the determination of residency for tuition purposes:

1. The student is 24 years of age or older by the first day of classes of the term for which residency status is sought at a Florida institution;
2. The student is married;
3. The student has children who receive more than half of their support from the student;
4. The student has other dependents that live with and receive more than half of their support from the student;
5. The student is a veteran of the United States Armed Forces or is currently serving on active duty in the United States Armed Forces for purposes other than training;
6. Both of the student's parents are deceased or the student is or was (until age 18) a ward/dependent of the court;
7. The student is working on a master's or doctoral degree during the term for which residency status is sought at a Florida institution; or
8. The student is classified as an independent by the financial aid office at the institution.

Evidence that the student meets one of these criteria will be requested by UWF.

A student who does not meet one of the criteria outlined above may be classified as an independent student only if he or she submits documentation that he or she provides fifty (50) percent or more of the cost of attendance for independent, in-state students as defined by the financial aid office at UWF (exclusive of federal, state, and institutional aid or scholarships).

Dependent Student. All other students who do not meet the above definition of an independent student shall be classified as dependent students for the determination of residency for tuition purposes.

Requirements:

In all cases of students claiming dependent status, students will be required to submit copies of their parents' (legal guardian, etc.) Federal and State tax returns (as applicable).

In cases of students claiming independent status which requires the student to prove his/her support of fifty (50) percent or more, students will be required to submit copies of their and their parents' Federal and State tax returns (as applicable).
