Starting Spring 2010 (January 7)

A one year Executive Program for a cohort of 20 full-time students will receive 75% of their tuition through scholarship funding for five 8-week semesters while taking two online courses per semester and will graduate December 2010. Students must already be admitted to UWF by November 15 to be selected for this scholarship. The departmental deadline for admission to the Software Engineering program at UWF is extended to July 15, 2009. Choose the Fall 2009 semester if you wish to get a head-start or choose Spring 2010 for admission and choose "Master's Program - Computer Science/Software Engineering" from the Major menu. These applicants must submit all UWF and Software Engineering program admission requirements (i.e., application fee, transcripts, letter of intent, letters of reference, and GRE/MAT/GMAT scores prior to November 15, 2009.
