

Community Engaged Faculty Award

The Community Engaged Faculty Award recognizes one UWF faculty member per college who has established sustained, mutually beneficial partnerships with community organizations. Through teaching, research or scholarship, and/or service, the recipient demonstrates a meaningful connection between academic work and real-world impact beyond the campus—advancing the public good and supporting UWF’s mission as a community-engaged institution.

Eligibility:

- Any UWF faculty member
- Community engagement activities must be directly related to the nominee’s teaching, research/scholarship, or service

Selection Criteria:

- Nominees will be evaluated based on the extent to which they demonstrate:
 - *Community Engaged Scholarship*- Evidence of integrating community engagement into teaching, research, and/or service in ways that contribute to learning and address community needs.
 - *Sustained & Mutually Beneficial Partnerships*- Ongoing collaboration with community partners characterized by mutual benefit, co-creation, and shared outcomes.
 - *Alignment with Institutional Mission*- Advances UWF goals related to community engagement and public impact.

Supporting Materials:

- Nominations, including self-nominations, are accepted (no more than 600 words)
- One letter of support from a community partner or collaborator
