Mission Statement

Content

• Identify and evaluate core concepts, principles, processes and methodologies of the discipline of history and/or public history.

Critical Thinking

- Identify and critically evaluate primary and secondary sources.
- Synthesize primary and secondary sources to craft sound historical interpretations that address questions of contemporary and/or scholarly relevance.

Communication

• Craft and discuss professional historical interpretations for multiple audiences.

Integrity/Values

 Articulate and demonstrate adherence to professional ethical practices as defined by the American Historical Association's Statement on Standards of Professional Conduct and/or the National Council on Public History's Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct.

Assessment of Student Learning Outcomes

We assess the SLOs through the evaluation of a comprehensive professional portfolio and public presentation that are completed as the final requirement of students' MA Capstone course. This portfolio includes artifacts of the student's work in coursework and applied settings. The portfolio is evaluated by a committee of two full-time departmental faculty members. Portfolios receive one of three evaluations: exceeds, meets, or does not meet expectations for entry-level employment in a History-related field.

Additionally, graduate students will be asked to complete an Exit Survey in which they assess their own intellectual growth and professional development over the course of their graduate experience.

Job Prospects for History MA Graduates

Students with a M.A. in History have strong skills in critical thinking, analysis, research, and the communication of complex ideas. They are well prepared for careers in: archives, museums and other cultural institutions, cultural resource management, historic preservation, non-profit administration, policy and business analysis, writing and editing, politics and government administration, government civil service and contracting, consulting, law and legal research, media careers, and careers in K-16 education.
