#### Critical Thinking

- Critically analyze interventions, programs processes, and outcomes to improve practice with individuals, families, groups and communities at all levels.
- Integrate cultural, gender, and other special life circumstances into social work practice.

#### Communication

- Communicate social work interventions at the individual, family, group, community, and organizational levels during experiential learning, case presentations, and written documents.

#### Integrity/Values

- Evaluate ethical values or dilemmas.
- Demonstrate professional behavior in accordance with NASW Code of Conduct.

### Assessment of Student Learning Outcomes

Assessment will be conducted through the Foundation Curriculum Assessment Instrument (FCAI), the foundation field instrument and a capstone assignment rubric.
