ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Dual Enrollment

Dual Enrollment is a coursework acceleration program established by Florida law for public, private, charter, and homeschool secondary students in sixth through 12th grade. To pursue Dual Enrollment at UWF, you must attend a public school district or private school that has a Dual Enrollment agreement with UWF; if homeschooled, you must complete an individual agreement, which will be routed as part of the application process. You must also have earned no fewer than three high school core academic credits.

Minimum scores for consideration:

- **High School GPA:** 3.00 unweighted on a 4.00 scale.
- For courses requiring academic placement:
- **SAT:** Reading-24; Writing and Language-25; Math-24; or
- ACT: Reading-19; English-17; Math-19; or
- **PERT:** Reading-106; Writing-103; Math-114.

Early Admission

Early Admission is a degree-seeking form of Dual Enrollment reserved for high school students entering their senior year. You must meet all requirements outlined in the articulation agreement between UWF and your respective school or school district. If such requirements are not outlined, minimum scores for consideration are:

- High School GPA: 3.00 weighted.
- SAT: 1110 total or ACT: 21 composite.

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GETTING STARTED

Apply for Dual Enrollment

Submit your completed *Dual Enrollment Application* for the semester you want to start.

Emails about your application and next steps will be sent to the address on your application. Please use a permanent, personal email and not a school email. Some school accounts may block external messages.

You will only have to complete the application once if you do not take a break of more than two semesters from dual enrollment classes at UWF.

Submit your completed *Dual Enrollment Approval Form* to dualenrollment@uwf.edu.

You will need to consult with your school counselor each semester to identify the class(es) you want to take. We recommend choosing a couple of backup classes in case your first choice(s) are full.

3 Create your UWF ArgoNet account.

If your application is accepted, UWF will email you with instructions to create your ArgoNet account.

Complete the mandatory *UWF Immunization Form*.

Log in to my.uwf.edu using your ArgoNet account. Search for "Immunization Status," where you will complete the immunization form and provide supporting documentation. This form must be completed before you can register for class.
