Maximize the benefits of your hard work as a Dual Enrollment student. Take college courses while simultaneously satisfying high school graduation requirements as a nondegree-seeking student at UWF.



Save on College Credit

Tuition, lab fees, a UWF parking pass, and instructional materials are covered for Dual Enrollment students.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Dual Enrollment

To pursue Dual Enrollment at UWF, you must be in sixth through 12th grade, have three or more high school core academic credits, and attend a public school district or private school that has a UWF Dual Enrollment agreement; if homeschooled, you must complete an individual agreement.

Minimum scores for consideration:

- **High school GPA:** 3.00 unweighted on a 4.00 scale
- **For courses requiring placement:**
 - **PERT:** Reading-106, Writing-103, Math-114
 - **ACCUPLACER:**
 - Through July 2022: Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics (QAS)-242; Reading-245; Writing-253
 - Since August 2022: Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics (QAS)-261; Reading-256; Writing-253
 - **SAT:** Math-480, Reading and Writing-490
 - **ACT:** Reading-19, English-17, Math-19
 - **CLT:** Sum of Verbal Reasoning and Grammar/Writing-38, Quantitative Reasoning-16

Early Admission

Early Admission is a degree-seeking form of Dual Enrollment for high school seniors. You must meet all requirements in the agreement between UWF and your school or district. If requirements are not outlined, you must submit a letter of recommendation from your high school principal or school counselor and meet the minimum scores for consideration:

- **High school GPA:** 3.00 weighted
- **Test score:**
 - **SAT:** 1060 total
 - **ACT:** 21 composite
 - **CLT:** 67 total

GETTING STARTED

Apply for Dual Enrollment

- 1 **Submit your completed *Dual Enrollment Application* for the semester you want to start.**

Emails about your application and next steps will be sent to the address on your application. Please use a permanent, personal email and not a school email. Some school accounts may block external messages.

You will only have to complete the application once if you do not take a break of more than two semesters from Dual Enrollment classes at UWF.

- 2 **Submit your completed *Dual Enrollment Approval Form* to dualenrollment@uwf.edu.**

You will need to consult with your school counselor each semester to identify the class(es) you want to take. We recommend choosing a couple of backup classes in case your first choice(s) are full.

- 3 **Create your UWF ArgoNet account.**

If your application is accepted, UWF will email you with instructions to create your ArgoNet account.

- 4 **Complete the mandatory *UWF Immunization Form*.**

Log in to my.uwf.edu using your ArgoNet account. Search for "Immunization Status," where you will complete the immunization form and provide supporting documentation. This form must be completed before you can register for class.
