University of West Florida Athletics ECONOMIC IMPACT ASSESSMENT





Key Findings

The UWF leadership team tasked the Haas Center with estimating the total economic impact of UWF Athletics on Escambia County, including contributions from football-related activities. The analysis also projects the economic impact associated with constructing the \$85.0 million multi-use outdoor facility. All values are presented in constant dollars, and employment related to athletic staff and program growth is shown as an annual average unless stated otherwise.

Dedicated to student-athlete development and community engagement, UWF supports 15 varsity athletic programs competing in NCAA Division II. The UWF Haas Center finds that UWF Athletics, combined with the planned construction investment, creates an average of 648 jobs per year, increasing Escambia County's annual labor income by \$18.3 million. The 15 athletic programs generate an average annual economic output of \$49.7 million, while local government and tax districts within Escambia County benefit from an estimated \$6.2 million annual increase in tax revenue.

Methodology

To assess the impact of UWF's athletic programs during the 2024–2028 timeframe, researchers run various economic events through an IMPLAN Input-Output (I-O) model. The methods used to produce IMPLAN's economic dataset and economic impact estimates are widely published in both professional publications and peer-reviewed academic journals. Many of these methods are considered standard best practices across various applied economic fields. Price changes are not factored into the assessment. The model assumes that consumer preferences, government policies, technology, and prices remain constant throughout the study period.

The research team utilizes data from UWF Athletics, including expenditure estimates and the various industry types impacted by the university's sports programs. All costs—such as wages and benefits for coaching staff, facility operations, renovations, travel, and community events—are modeled for the Northwest Florida region over a two-year period. Operations for each varsity sports program are organized by UWF's athletics leadership team.

This report examines all varsity athletic programs, including: Men's Football, Men's Baseball, Men's and Women's Basketball, Men's and Women's Cross Country, Men's and Women's Golf, Men's and Women's Soccer, Men's and Women's Tennis, Women's Softball, Women's Volleyball and Women's Swimming & Diving.

Impact Definitions

Direct Effects: These values serve as the inputs that are impacted by the model multipliers to generate indirect and induced effects.

Indirect Effects: These values represent business-to-business purchases in the supply chain that stem from the initial industry expenditures. For example, purchases from local vendors, contractors acquiring materials, and similar activities fall within this category.

Induced Effects: These values stem from household spending of labor income after taxes. For example, when employees spend a portion of their income on goods and services within the local economy, these purchases are categorized as induced spending.



Output

Output serves as the foundation for all IMPLAN model calculations. UWF Athletics generates a total economic output of \$248.6 million from 2024 to 2028, which encompasses direct, indirect, and induced effects:

Direct Output: Totals **\$148.2** million and captures UWF's immediate spending. This serves as the baseline for evaluating UWF's economic influence.

Indirect Output: Totals **\$58.3** million and represents the economic activity generated from business-to-business expenditures. Examples include transactions with local vendors, service providers, and contractors purchasing materials.

Induced Output: Totals **\$42.1** million and arises from household spending by employees directly or indirectly tied to UWF Athletics. For example, when Coach Nobles buys coffee on his way to work, that purchase contributes to the induced effects.

Personal Income & Employment

In terms of employment, UWF Athletics directly and indirectly supports a total of 656 jobs:

- 487 jobs are directly tied to athletics operations and
- 161 jobs are created through the indirect and induced effects stemming from UWF's economic activities.

These employment impacts reflect UWF's significant role in supporting the regional workforce and contributing to job stability beyond its immediate operations.

Labor income totals \$91.6 million, capturing the full value of employment-related earnings. This figure includes wages, salaries, benefits, and payroll expenditures, making it a comprehensive measure of "personal income" in the local economy.



Industry Growth

The impacts of UWF's athletic programs are felt across Northwest Florida, with the Pensacola area and surrounding counties experiencing the most significant growth. UWF Athletics contributes to various sectors, including sports, education, tourism, and community redevelopment.

While many industries benefit, the top 10 industries by percentage of economic output growth are detailed in the accompanying table. IMPLAN multipliers calculate the scale and magnitude of these effects through an industry-specific matrix for the region. The construction of the new multi-use outdoor facility amplifies these impacts:

- Industries related to culture, arts, and experiences experience growth as construction progresses.
- Building material manufacturers benefit from the demand for supplies.
- Travel and accommodation services see increased activity due to visiting stakeholders, teams, and fans.

Value Added

Value added represents the difference between an industry's total output and the cost of intermediate inputs. It serves as a critical measure of an industry's contribution to the local economy and gross domestic product (GDP). Over the specified period, UWF Athletics generates a total added value of \$120.6 million for the local economy.

Direct Value Added: Accounts for \$71.0 million, reflecting contributions directly generated by UWF's athletic programs.

Indirect Value Added: Totals \$24.7 million, arising from business-to-business transactions resulting from UWF-related economic activities. These transactions demonstrate the ripple effects of UWF's expenditures, as funds flow through various sectors in the local community.

Induced Value Added: Totals \$24.9 million, representing value created through household spending by employees and others connected to UWF Athletics.

Taxes

UWF Athletics generates over \$31.2 million in tax revenue across local, county, state, and federal levels. These funds support essential infrastructure projects, such as roads, bridges, and schools, with a notable reinvestment into the local community.

- At the federal level, tax revenue amounts to \$20.6 million, supporting military expenditures and other national priorities.
- State tax revenues total \$6.6 million.
- Local government and tax districts within Escambia County benefit from an estimated \$6.2 million annual increase in tax revenue.



Economic Impact of Facility Construction

The economic impact of UWF Athletics has previously been quantified by the Haas Center. However, key distinctions must be noted when comparing past and current findings. The addition of the multi-use outdoor facility will significantly enhance the athletic department's capacity to serve students and the broader campus community. The \$85 million investment includes:

- New classrooms, conference spaces, and other campus resources comprising 50 percent of the project.
- Construction of a new residence hall making up the remaining 50 percent.

This facility promises to enrich campus culture, enhance student experiences, and deliver a rapid and sustainable return on investment. The model results associated with this construction project are summarized in the following table. It is important to note that this model exclusively analyzes the impacts stemming from the construction phase of the project.

TOTAL IMPACT OF FACILITY CONSTRUCTION

The construction of the multi-use outdoor facility is expected to support significant job creation across direct, indirect, and induced spending. Employment may reach 191 jobs, with approximately 147 positions directly aligned with the project itself. An additional 44 jobs will emerge through business-to-business purchases and employee spending within the local economy.

A substantial increase in personal income is projected for the construction phase, totaling \$52.5 million. This project will also contribute \$72.6 million to the region's Gross Regional Product (GRP), another measure of value added.

The total economic output for the facility's construction is nearly half of the overall athletics impact, amounting to \$124.2 million. Additionally, tax revenues will cycle back into the economy at multiple levels.



Economic Impact of UWF Football

Since its inception in 2016, the University of West Florida's football program has rapidly risen to national prominence, establishing itself as a formidable force in NCAA Division II football.

In just their second season (2017), the Argonauts achieved an unprecedented milestone, reaching the NCAA Division II National Championship game. Although they narrowly missed securing the title, their remarkable success showcased the program's exceptional talent, determination, and resilience.

Building on this early momentum, the Argonauts won their first NCAA Division II Football National Championship in 2019 with an electrifying 48-40 victory over Minnesota State. This historic triumph made UWF the fastest program to win a national title in Division II history. The 2019 season highlighted a dominant offense and a stellar defense, with standout performances such as quarterback Austin Reed, who surpassed 4,000 passing yards and set multiple school records.

Since the championship, the football program has continued to thrive, consistently achieving top 10 national rankings and securing multiple playoff appearances within the competitive Gulf South Conference (GSC). This success reflects a commitment to excellence both on and off the field, as the program prioritizes athletic performance, academic achievement, and community involvement.

Community Impact: UWF football has significantly elevated the university's profile and strengthened community engagement. Home games at PenAir Field attract large, enthusiastic crowds, uniting students, alumni, and local supporters. This enthusiasm fosters school spirit and energizes the Pensacola community. Additionally, the coaching staff emphasizes academic success, with players frequently earning recognition for academic achievements and volunteer efforts. UWF's football program is poised for continued success, driven by an expanding fan base, dedicated student-athletes, and a coaching staff committed to personal and athletic development. The demand for enhanced facilities, such as the multi-use outdoor facility, has grown considerably. This investment aligns with community support and ensures that UWF football can sustain its momentum.

The construction of the new facility **is not** included in the football program's specific economic impact analysis. While football expenses are anticipated to rise following the facility's completion, these increases were conservatively modeled at a 3 percent annual growth rate.

Conclusion

The proposed \$85 million construction plan represents a transformative investment for the University of West Florida and Escambia County. Half of the funds will support the development of the athletic stadium, while the other half will be allocated to multipurpose student housing. Over a five-year period, these construction efforts are projected to expand the local economy by \$124.2 million, with an annual impact of approximately \$24.8 million.

This state-of-the-art facility will provide resources that extend well beyond athletics. By incorporating classroom spaces, conference rooms, and areas for community-focused initiatives, the project will support academic excellence, enhance student experiences, and foster a legacy of achievement for future generations.

The UWF Haas Center's analysis highlights the significant economic contributions of UWF Athletics, which—together with construction activities—support an average of 648 jobs annually and contribute to a \$91.6 million increase in personal income within Escambia County. Government agencies at all levels benefit as well, with \$31.2 million in tax revenue generated across local, state, and federal levels.

Over a four-year period, UWF Athletics has driven \$248.6 million in total economic output, averaging \$49.7 million annually across 15 varsity programs. These impacts reflect UWF's growing reputation as a powerhouse within the Gulf South Conference and a recognized leader on the national stage. As UWF continues to invest in athletic programs and facilities, the Argonauts' legacy of excellence is poised to endure and thrive.

SWIMMING & DIVING

The University of West Florida's (UWF) Swimming and Diving program, though relatively new compared to its peers, has quickly established itself as a formidable force in NCAA Division II under the leadership of Head Coach Phil Kraus. Since its founding in 2013, the program has seen significant growth and success, consistently achieving top placements in conference championships and regularly qualifying athletes for the NCAA national meet. The University of West Florida men's and women's cross country teams have proven to be ascending programs in the Gulf South Conference under the leadership of head coach Caleb Carmichael. Both programs have had teams or individuals qualify for the NCAA Division II National Championships.

Carmichael leads a balanced training approach for the student-athletes to be at their peak running performance at the right time. The team participates in select competitive meets with some of the best competition in the country to provide the opportunity for student-athletes to hit personal bests and earn top individual performances in the south region.
