### 1. Administrative Reports

Executive Report - Dr. George Ellenberg

Enrollment: FTIC Enrollment is up by 7.1% from Fall 2018.

6% increase in the local 3 counties area (Escambia, Santa Rosa & Okaloosa)

Fall 2019 is currently the most academically inclined class; average GPA is a 3.8, 1163 for SAT Score and 25 for ACT Score.

We have an increase in transfer students, graduate students and Doctoral Students.

CONCUR: The University is now implementing a new travel software, CONCUR. This software will allow you to attach and upload travel receipts and documents in order to help streamline paper processes. Some departments will begin testing in December. Full implementation of this software will begin in March for all departments.

UWF will be on the Triumph agenda in September. This is a \$14 Million 5-year project to develop workforce in the area of engineering and cybersecurity. This proposal says that we can get students through their degree program along with industry type certificates. We hope to tie the academic programs to include the certificates. We are not certain when the official Triumph meeting will be.

BOG Update: Dr. Martha Saunders contract was renewed unanimously. BOG is only extending President's contracts for a year at a time.

4-year graduation rate: Current metric standard is 50%, it is being looked at to increase this to 65%. 2-year graduation rate: BOG is currently looking at a 2 or 3 year graduation rate for transfer students.

Performance Based Funding: There is no more Top/Bottom 3. If you decline 2 year in a row you have to put an improvements plan together to continue to get money. This has reintroduced some volitivity. In the past, schools have constantly gone up and down on improvement and now some of that has been reinjected into the metrics. This will just be more navigation within the metrics for UWF.

There has been discussion of the legislature requested to direct the board to come back in December with a performance based funding model alternative. The only idea at this point is categories of institutions: Preeminent (UF, FSU & USF), Universities of Distinction. This would provide an institution the opportunity to receive funding that is not of preeminent stature.

UCF: The final report of misused funds has been posted. When this first broke, it was \$34-\$37 Million misused for building a resident hall. Since the investigation, the final report was \$99 Million misused over the past decade. We will feel the ripple effects from this for a very long time in regards to processes and how to use carryforward money.

## Human Resources - Jeff Comeau

It is important to understand that Human Resources handles all pre-employment documents. There are only 3 of them: Background Check, Controlled Substance Form, and Florida Retirement Plan Certification Form. Any documents that are "Post Offer" are to be completed by the hiring department.

The State is going to be offering retirees the opportunity to elect into a Medicare Advantage Plan. If you are eligible for this, you will be notified. There is currently nothing posted about this, more information will be distributed after October 1.

There is currently no update regarding FSLA.
